Dinner Money


Please top up dinner money payments in advance of your child having a school dinner.

As a reminder, grapes and cherry tomatoes should be cut into quarters lengthways to reduce the risk of choking.




Bikeability Checklist

Please check your child's cycle before the start of the course. If the cycle is not roadworthy, pupils won't be able to participate in the course. Faults are often easily fixed but occasionally a new part from a bike shop is required so please check your child's cycle well in advance.

Cycle Checklist

Please tick off the cycle, helmet and clothing checks below:



1. MECHANICAL CONDITION:
Are the saddle, handlebars and wheel fixed on tight?

2. FRAME & SEAT POST:
Is the frame the appropriate size for your child?
Can your child comfortably touch the floor with their toes whilst sat on the saddle?


3. BRAKES:
Does the cycle have a working front and rear brake capable of stopping the cycle?
Can your child comfortably reach and operate the brake levers?

4. TYRES:
Are both tyres inflated to the required tyre pressure stamped on the side of the tyre?

5. CHAIN:
Have you cleaned and oiled the chain?

6. GEARS:
If present, do the gears change smoothly without any delays?

Did you know? Many local bike shops offer free cycle checks for Bikeability participants.



1. Does the helmet conform to BS EN 1078:1997 or equivalent (check sticker inside the helmet)?

2. Does the helmet sit comfortably on the top of your child's head?

3. Is the peak of the helmet sitting about two finger widths from your child's eyebrows?

4. Do the side adjusters sit just below your child's ears forming a nice V on either side of their head?

5. When done up, does the chin strap allow for two fingers to fit between the buckle and your child's chin?

The Nobel Peace Prize

Alfred Nobel was a 19th century Swedish inventor and engineer. He invented dynamite, which was used to destroy many things! Perhaps because of this, in his will, Nobel left money and instructions to award five special prizes each year. He said that one of these, the Nobel Peace Prize, should be given to a person, or group of people, who had done the most or best work to promote peace between nations.

- The Nobel Peace Prize is presented in Oslo on 10th December each year by the King of Norway
- The winner is given a diploma, a medal and over 1 million US dollars to carry on their work

HALL OF FAME

Rigoberta Menchu

Very few people had heard of Rigoberta Menchu when it was announced that she had won the Nobel Peace Prize in 1992. However, Rigoberta was one of the bravest women ever to have been awarded this prestigious prize. She was born in 1959 into a Mayan Indian family who lived and worked in Guatemala. The Mayan people were treated cruelly by the government and the army in Guatemala. The Menchu family were Christians and they believed it was their duty to fight against such injustice. The family learnt Spanish from the local priests so they could stand up for the rights of their people. One by one the members of the family were killed in the most dreadful way by the government soldiers, first Rigoberta's 16 year old brother, then her father because he was a union leader and then finally her mother. Rigoberta knew she would be next, so she escaped to Mexico where she wrote her life story and made a film about the bad things happening in Guatemala. Rigoberta continued to stand up against injustice and for more than twenty years worked as a UNESCO Goodwill Ambassador to promote a culture of peace and protect the rights of people to live in their own country.
