

### (continued...) Our Safeguarding Team and Open Door Policy

We believe that safeguarding should be transparent, clear, and easy to understand for everyone. Our systems are well-promoted, easily understood, and easily accessible for children to confidently report any form of abuse or neglect, knowing their concerns will be treated seriously.

We operate an open-door policy for children and families. If you or your child has any concerns or worries, you can ask to speak to any member of our safeguarding team at any time. Simply contact the school office, and we will arrange a meeting as soon as possible. If the staff member you've requested is teaching, we will offer an alternative time that works for you, or arrange for another member of the safeguarding team to meet with you promptly.

As we approach the holidays, we will be teaching the children about important safety resources: The NSPCC Helpline

We will remind children about the NSPCC helpline (0800 028 0285). Children can call this number if they need help or advice, and it's available from 08:00 to 20:00 Monday to Friday, and 09:00 to 18:00 at weekends. Your Safe 5 Adults

We encourage every child to identify their "Safe 5" – five trusted adults (both at home and at school) whom they can talk to if they're worried or upset. This might include family members, teachers, teaching assistants, or other school staff. Knowing who these people are gives children confidence that they always have someone to turn to.

### It's Always Best to Talk

We want all children to understand that it's important to receive the right help at the right time to address safeguarding risks and prevent issues escalating. We encourage children to share their concerns or worries with a trusted adult – whether that's at home or at school. No concern is too small, and talking about worries is always the right thing to do.

### **Working Together**

Safeguarding is a partnership between school and home. We're here to support you and your children, and we encourage open communication. If you ever have any concerns about your child's safety or wellbeing – or that of another child – please don't hesitate to contact us.

Remember: our door is always open, and we're here to help.

Together, we can keep our children safe.

Have a wonderful Christmas for those of you celebrating and a well-earned rest for those that are just looking forward to a break, and we are super excited to see you all back ready for learning on January 6th.




We are a nut-free school to ensure the safety of children and staff with nut allergies. We would like to remind you that many chocolate spreads, including popular brands, contain hazelnuts.


